One of those nights the director of the Life House took some of the residents to visit her at the hospital. While visiting her, Stephanie said, "Come on Pearly Gates, get here already." She was a great resident and serves as an

example to all the other residents. It is not how you start life but how you finish. Stephanie finished well. She will be missed.
