We sat down with Dana, and then Ira, to ask them about their time in the house, how it has been, and what the future holds for them.

Dana found the Life House through her pastor who referred her to New Life. We asked Dana what she liked about the program so far and she told us that she likes being able to turn bad habits into good ones. Dana and Ira have been able to strengthen their relationship through their time in the house, and she is glad that she is able to give Ira a sense of stability.

Currently, Dana is looking to acquire her CNA certification. She is excited to be saving money for the future and start building a life for her and her son after leaving the Life House.



After speaking with Dana, we were able to talk with Ira after he got home from school. We asked about living at the Life House, how school is going, the differences he has noticed in himself and in his mom, and we talked about music.

Ira told us that he likes living at the Life House. He likes having his own bed, being able to watch tv, and how close they are to the local library.

Since enrolling at Lincoln Elementary, Ira has made a ton of friends. He told us everyone in his class is his friend, that he likes his teacher, and that music was his least favorite subject. Ira really like working on his math flash cards at home with Dana.

Living at the Life House, Ira said he really likes how active he and his mom are. They go on walks and read together, they exercise and have fun.

Lastly, Ira wanted to share his music tastes. He really likes listening to For King and Country, The Beatles, Eddie Money, Train, and about twenty other bands ranging from Bon Jovi to ELO.
